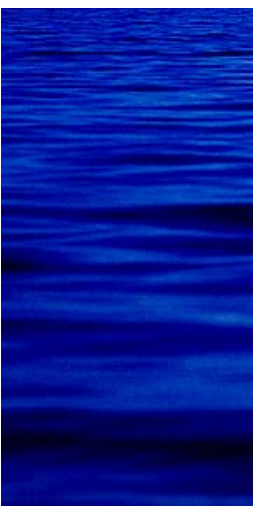




The Columbia River trade corridor is the backbone of the region's economy

Columbia Snake River System

30 million tons of foreign trade. \$20 billion in value each year. Nation's number one wheat export gateway and number one barley export gateway. Third largest grain export gateway in the world. West coast's number one dry bulks export gateway. Import containers and autos serve 43 states. Fed by 365-mile, 14-foot draft inland barge system with nation's only successful container-on-barge service.

Longview. Longview. 43 - foot channel. Average 1.-1.2 million tons exports (calcined coke, forest products) .25-.4 million tons imports (steel, salt, wind energy cargo). Also Weyerhaeuser, Millennium Bulk Terminals (formerly Reynolds Metals) docks. 270 acres heavy industrial land.

Kalama. 43-foot channel. 9.2 million tons exports (corn, wheat, soybeans, barley), over 360,000 tons imports (steel products, toluene, logs). Also Port of Kalama Break Bulk dock, Port of Kalama Grain Elevator and Berth, Kalama Export Grain Elevator and Berth, RSG Forest Products Barge Berth, Emerald Kalama Chemical dock. 220 acres in three industrial sites.
