DeFazio Transit Station Dedication at PDX









On October 27, the Port of Portland and TriMet dedicated the Portland airport transit station in honor of former House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee Chairman Honorable Peter DeFazio (D, OR-4). The region will reap the benefits of his work on light rail, bridges, waterways, and other critical infrastructure needs for many years to come. In addition to leadership from the Port of Portland and TriMet, retiring Congressman Earl Blumenauer (D, OR-3), Congresswoman Suzanne Bonamici (D, OR-1) and former Congressman David Wu also participated in the event. PNWA staff thanked former Congressman DeFazio and will continue to engage with him on regulatory and inland waterway infrastructure issues.

PNWA Feedback Request on EPA Clean Ports Program

We are seeking feedback from our membership on the EPA's Clean Ports Program. A webinar was held by the EPA on October 31st to discuss some of the details of the program and how the EPA plans to allocate the \$3 Billion from the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) for the program. The IRA provides that all Clean Ports program funds must be obligated by September 30, 2027. The Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) is anticipated in February or March 2024, so if there are items we would like to advocate for changing in the program, now is the time to say so! Please take a moment to complete this brief survey by Friday, November 10th.





November 2, 2023, the U.S. Department of Transportation's Maritime Administration (MARAD) announced over \$653 million to fund 41 port improvement

projects across the nation under the Port Infrastructure Development Program (PIDP). As part of President Biden's Investing in America agenda – a key pillar of Bidenomics – this funding will help grow capacity and increase efficiency at coastal seaports, Great Lakes ports, and inland river ports. A significant portion of domestic and international U.S. commerce by weight, (over 2.3 billion short tons) moves by water. The port improvement projects announced today will strengthen supply chain reliability, create workforce development opportunities, speed up the movement of goods, and improve the safety, reliability and resilience of ports. These investments are part of the largest dedicated funding for ports and waterways in history – nearly \$17 billion through the President's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

Washington Public Works Board opens application cycle for broadband funding



The Washington State Public Works Board opens applications for broadband funding, offering \$15.8 million in grants and low-interest loans for broadband

construction projects. Projects in

distressed counties are eligible for 30% grant and 70% loan funding until funds are exhausted. Local governments, tribes, nonprofit organizations, cooperative associations, multiparty entities, limited liability corporations (LLC), and incorporated businesses or partnerships are eligible to apply. The Board may award funds to projects passing threshold ratings based on a competitive ranking process.

Approximately \$15.8 million is available for broadband construction projects. The preapplication deadline is 11:59 p.m. on January 4, 2024. A 30-day objection period will follow, and final applications are due at 11:59 p.m. on March 22, 2024. Awards are expected in May 2024.
