## **Idaho Wheat Commission at Wheat Marketing Center**

Neil Maunu and Anthony Peña presented to Idaho wheat farmers at the Wheat Marketing Center in Portland. We provided an updated on the Columbia Snake River System, and



the mediation and litigation history surrounding the system and the federal hydropower projects located on the river. This was a great opportunity to get in front a group of members and update them on current trends on the system and to provide advocacy updates on our own efforts. Additionally, in attendance was Captain Dan Jordan representing the Columbia River Bar Pilots, delivering an

outstanding presentation highlighting the crucial responsibilities of Bar Pilots in navigating the river.

## **Congresswoman McMorris Rodgers Roundtable**



At the Washington Grain Commission offices in Spokane, we participated in a Lower Snake River Dam (LSRD) Roundtable. In attendance was Anthony Peña, PNWA, Kurt Miller, NWPPA, Michelle Hennings, WAWG, and stakeholders including Ports of Lewiston, Clarkston, Whitman County, Northwest Grain Growers, McGregor and agriculture and utilities representatives.

This offered an opportunity to inform the congresswoman about the concerns related to the LSRD, as well as to rally supporters, showcase our backing, and bring increased attention to the matter. We discussed our involvement in the mediation, highlighting our exclusion and expressing apprehensions regarding the proposed commitments by both the US Government and the Plaintiffs. Expressing gratitude to Congresswoman McMorris Rodgers for her ongoing support, we pledged to maintain collaboration with her office in safeguarding the LSRD. Additionally, we addressed some of the Congresswoman's questions and concerns.

#### **Revised Lock Closure Schedule**



For the Hiram M. Chittenden Locks, the Seattle District of the Corps of Engineers announced the large locks reopened two days ahead of schedule on December 28, 2023. A temporary marine fender has been installed as the center miter gates were removed. Mariners are advised to operate at extremely low speed 2.5 knots or less, follow all Tower and lock operator

instructions, and to exercise extreme caution entering and exiting the large lock chamber. The large lock miter center gate will close to vessel traffic on January 14, 2024 at 12:01 AM and remain closed until February 12, 2024. It is anticipated that this will be the last large lock closure until mid-October 2024 when the new gates will be installed. For the Columbia Snake River System, the Portland District of the Corps of Engineers <u>announced</u> that the scheduled closure for the John Day Lock and Dam will close one day earlier than previously stated. Currently, all other lock outage schedules remain the same. As a reminder, the extended lock closure schedule is as follows:
